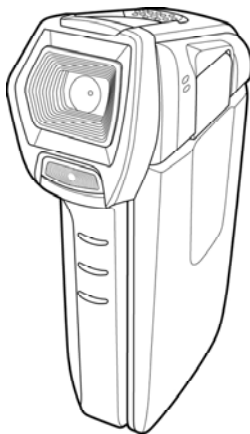

Precautions

General precautions

- Do not use or store the product in dusty, dirty, or sandy areas, as its components may be damaged.
- Do not store the product in a hot environment. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the product in cold areas. When the product warms up to its normal temperature, moisture can form inside; this may damage the electronic circuits.
- Do not attempt to open the casing or attempt your own repairs. High-voltage internal components create the risk of electric shock when exposed.
- Do not drop or knock the product. Rough handling may damage the internal components.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents or strong detergents to clean the product. Wipe the product with a slightly damp soft cloth.
- Do not fire the flash while it is too close to the subject's eyes. Intense light from the flash can cause eye damage if it is fired too close to the eyes. When using the flash, the camera should be at least one meter from the eyes of the subject.
- Do not open the battery cover while an image is being recorded. Doing so will not only make storage of the current image impossible, it can also corrupt other image data already stored in file.
- If the product or any of its accessories are not working properly, take them to your nearest qualified service center. The personnel there will assist you and if necessary, arrange for the product to be repaired.
- Test for proper operation before using the camera.

Notes on the LCD Screen

Caution must be observed when dealing with the fluid contained in the LCD. Ensure that the fluid does not leak if the screen becomes cracked or damaged. If this occurs, follow these steps:

- If the fluid makes contact with skin, wipe it with a clean cloth then rinse with a large amount of water.
- If the fluid makes contact with eyes, wash eyes with clean water for at least 15 minutes and seek immediate medical attention.
- If the fluid is swallowed, first rinse mouth with water, then drink a large amount of water and induce vomiting. Seek immediately medical attention.

Waterproof

Waterproof performance

- The camera's waterproof performance is equivalent to the IPX8 standard.
- The supplied accessories are not waterproof.

When using the camera

- The waterproof properties of the camera apply to fresh water and saltwater only; they do not apply to cleaning substances, chemicals, or water from spas, etc. Any such liquids should be wiped off immediately.
- Do not immerse in water at a depth greater than 3.0 m (10 ft).
- Do not subject the camera to highly pressurized water.
- Do not immerse in water for longer than 60 minutes. After 60 minutes of use in water, allow the camera to dry for at least 10 minutes.
- Do not immerse in water warmer than 40°C (104°F).
- Do not open or close the battery/card compartment cover when the camera is wet or underwater.

- Do not open or close the battery/card compartment cover with wet hands.
- Do not open the battery/card compartment cover next to water or a pool.
- The camera is not dust-proof.
- Do not bump or knock the camera underwater, otherwise the battery/card compartment cover may open.

After using the camera

- Be sure to wipe any dirt or sand off the waterproof sealing material or its contraction surface. Dirt or sand may scratch the material or the surface, making the camera less resistant to water.
- To wash sand, dirt or dust off the camera, rinse it under running tap water or soak it in a bowl of fresh water or 2 or 3 minutes.
- Do not use any soapy water, mild detergents, alcohol or similar liquids to clean the camera. They may make the camera less resistant to water.

The sealing material that makes this camcorder waterproof is replaceable at an additional cost and should be replaced once a year to maintain the camera's water resistance. Please contact us for details to avail of this service.

Operation conditions

- This camera is designed for use in temperatures ranging from 0°C to 40°C (32°F to 104°F).
- Do not use or keep the camera in the following areas:
 - In areas subject to direct sunlight
 - In areas subject to high humidity or dust
 - Near air conditioners, heaters, or other areas subject to temperature extremes

- Inside of a closed vehicle, especially one parked in the sun.
- In areas subject to strong vibration

Power supply

- Use only the type of battery that came with your camera. Using any other type of battery may damage the equipment and invalidate the warranty.
- Ensure the battery is inserted correctly. Inserting the battery incorrectly can cause damage to the product and possibly start a fire.
- Remove the battery to avoid the fluid leakage if the camera is not going to be used for a long time.
- If the battery is crushed or damaged, remove it immediately to avoid the battery fluid leakage and abnormal expansion.

1 Introduction

Read this section to learn about the features and functions of the video camera. This chapter also covers system requirements, package contents, and descriptions of the hardware components.

1.1 System requirements

The video camera requires a PC with the following specifications:

- Windows® XP SP2/Vista/Windows 7 operating system
- Intel®/AMD Dual-Core or higher
- At least 1 GB of RAM or higher
- Graphic card with DirectX 9 support (DirectX 10 recommended)
- Standard USB 1.1 port or higher
- At least 2 GB of available disk space

● **Note:**

A USB 1.1 port will enable you to transfer files to and from your host PC, but transfer speeds will be much faster with a USB 2.0 port.

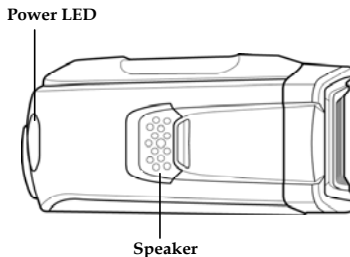

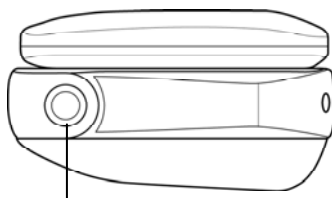

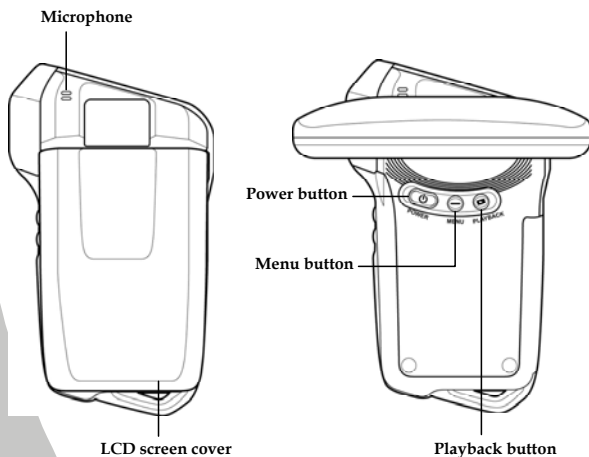

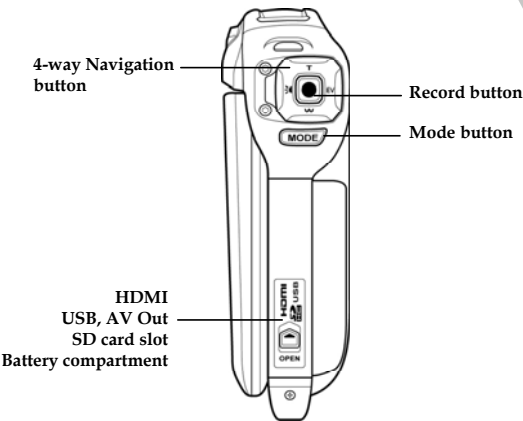

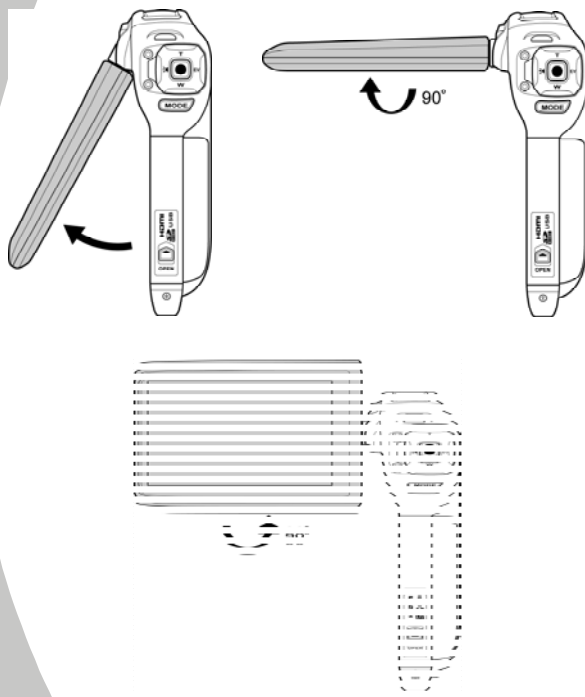





1.4.6 Adjusting the LCD display

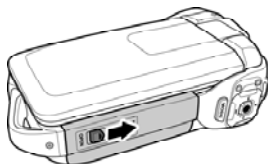
2 Getting started

Read this section to learn how to start using the video camera. This section covers basic functions such as switching on, inserting the battery and memory card, and configuring preliminary settings. See later chapters for advanced functions.

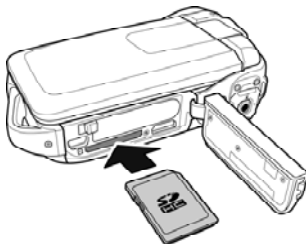
2.1 Inserting an SD card (SD card sold separately)

An SD card can be installed in the video camera to provide additional storage space for still images and video clips.

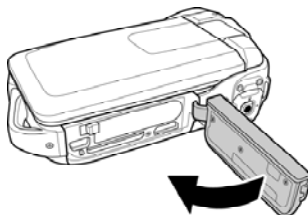
1. Push the lock to open the battery cover as shown in the illustration.



2. Insert the memory card. Ensure that the gold contacts are facing downwards. We recommend using a memory card with a capacity of 1 GB or higher.



3. Close the battery cover.



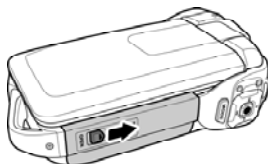
2.2 Inserting the battery

This video camera is designed to use a rechargeable Li-ion battery. Only use the battery supplied or similar batteries recommended by the manufacturer or your dealer.

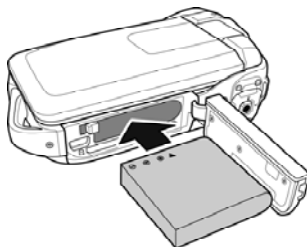
● **Note:**

Install the battery exactly as described here. Installing the battery incorrectly could cause damage to the video camera and possibly start a fire.

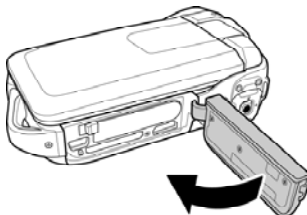
1. Push the lock to open the battery cover as shown in the illustration.



2. Insert the battery. Ensure that the battery contacts match to the contacts inside the battery compartment.



3. Close the battery cover.



2.3 Charging the battery

You can charge the battery with the charging unit provided. Follow the below steps to charge your battery.

1. Connect one end of the power cord to the charging unit and then plug the other end to the wall outlet.
2. Insert the Li-ion battery into the charging bay.
3. The orange LED will light up for proper charging.
4. After full charge, the LED turns green.
5. The actual charging time depends on the current battery capacity and charging conditions.

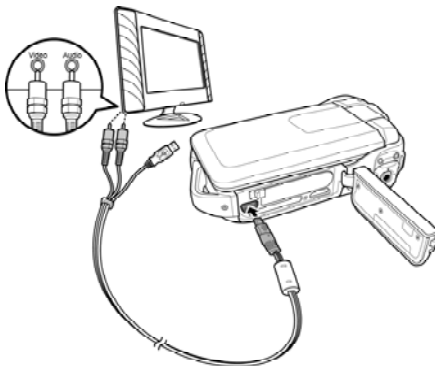


2.4 Turning on/off the video camera

Press and hold the **Power** button to turn the video camera on/off.

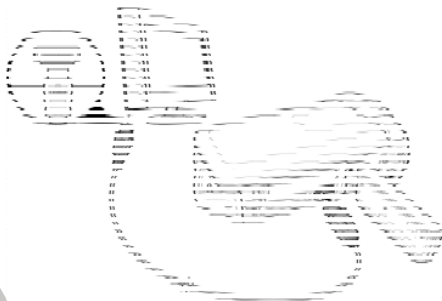
2.5 Connecting to TV using a USB/AV Cable

To view pictures or videos on a TV, connect the video camera to a TV using the supplied USB/AV cable as shown.



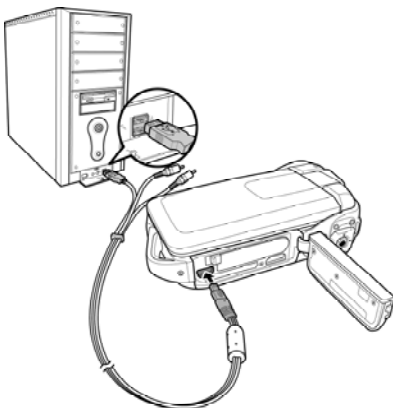
2.6 Connecting to TV using an HDMI Cable

You can also connect the video camera to a TV using the HDMI cable.



2.7 Connecting to PC using a USB/AV Cable

Connect the video camera to a computer with the USB/AV cable provided as shown.



2.8 Changing modes

The video camera can operate in three modes: **Video**, **Photo**, and **SET**. Press the **Mode** button to toggle different modes.

2.9 Before you start

Before you start using the video camera, some basic settings such as **Date/Time**, **Language** and **Beep** need to be configured.

2.9.1 Setting the date and time

To adjust the date and time, please do the following:

1. Press the **Mode** button to switch to the Set mode.

2. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Date/Time**.
3. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.
4. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the field to be adjusted.
5. Use the **Up/Down Navigation** button to adjust the value.
6. Repeat steps 4-5 to adjust desired fields.
7. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to exit.



2.9.2 Setting the language

To select the language, please do the following:

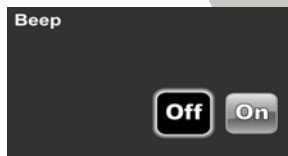
1. Press the **Mode** button to switch to the Set mode.
2. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Language**.
3. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.
4. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired language.
5. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to exit.



2.9.3 Setting the beep

To adjust the beep, please do the following:

1. Press the **Mode** button to switch to the Set mode.
2. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Beep**.
3. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.
4. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Off** or **On**.
5. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to exit.



3 Using the Video Camera

3.1 Recording Videos

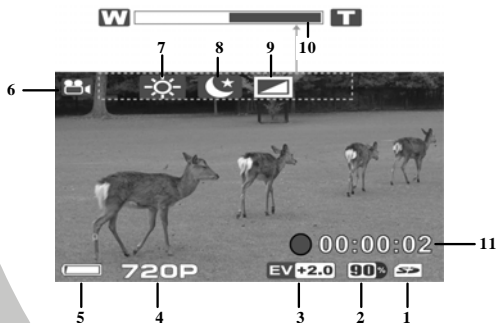
To record a movie, please do the following:














1. Press the **Power** button to turn on the video camera. The video camera enters the Video mode.
2. Press the **Record** button to start recording the video.

To adjust the video, you may:

- Use the **T/W** button to zoom in/out.
(applicable to 720P and WVGA only)
 - Press the **Left Navigation** button to turn the LED flash on/off.
 - Toggle the **Right Navigation** button to select different exposure compensation values.
3. Press the **Record** button again to stop video recording.

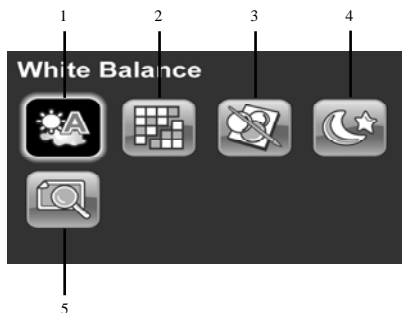

3.2 Video Menu

To access the Video menu, please do the following:

1. Make sure you are in the Video mode. Press the **Mode** button to switch to the Video mode if not.
2. Press the **Menu** button to open the Video menu.
3. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to scroll through the selections until the desired one is highlighted.
4. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.
5. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to choose the desired settings and press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.
6. Press the **Menu** button to exit.

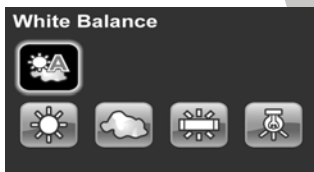

3.2.1 White Balance

The White Balance selection allows you to set the white balance when recording videos under specific lighting conditions.

To set the white balance, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired option:
 - **Auto:** Select this option to let the video camera set the white balance automatically.
 - **Sunny:** Select this option for daylight.
 - **Cloudy:** Select this option for cloudy days.
 - **Tungsten:** Select this option for normal indoor lighting conditions.
 - **Fluorescent:** Select this option for fluorescent lighting.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.



3.2.2 Resolution

The Resolution selection allows you to set the resolution before you record a video. The higher the resolution, the more memory space is required.

To select the resolution, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired option:
 - **1080P:** Select this option for 1920 x 1080 resolution.
 - **720P:** Select this option for 1280 x 720 resolution.
 - **WVGA:** Select this option for 848 x 480 resolution.

- **QVGA:** Select this option for 320 x 240 resolution.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.

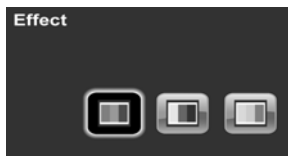


3.2.3 Effect

The Effect selection allows you to change the recording effect.

To set the effect, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired option:
 - **Color:** Select this option for color photography.
 - **Sepia:** Select this option for brown color effect.
 - **Black and white:** Select this option for monochrome effect.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.

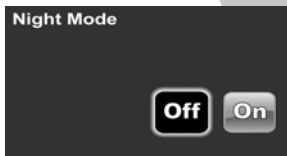


3.2.4 Night Mode

The Night Mode helps you to get better results while shooting at night.

To set the night mode, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Off** or **On**.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.

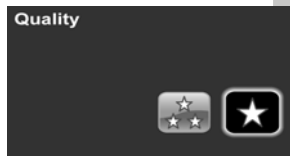


3.2.5 Quality

The Quality selection allows you to set the video quality. More storage space is required for better quality.

To set the quality, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Fine** or **Normal**.
 - **Normal:** Select this option for normal quality.
 - **Fine:** Select this option for high quality.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.

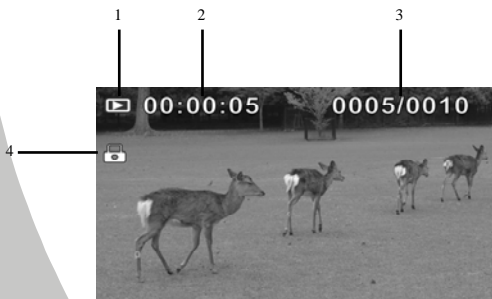






3.3 Playing Videos

To play videos, please do the following:

1. Make sure you are in the Video mode. Press the **Mode** button to switch to the Video mode if not.
2. Press the **Playback** button to enter the Video Playback mode.
3. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired video.
4. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to play back the video.
 - To pause during playback, press the **Down Navigation** button. To resume, press the **Down Navigation** button again.
 - To fast forward/rewind, press the **Left/Right Navigation** button. To return to the normal speed, press the **Middle Navigation** button.
5. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to stop.

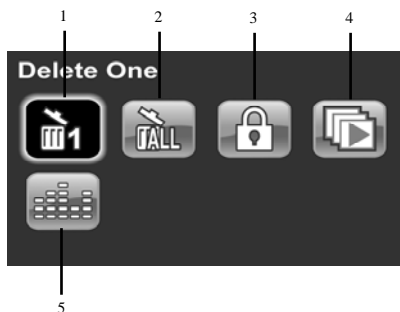

3.4 Video Playback Menu

To access the Video Playback menu, please do the following:

1. In Video mode, press the **Playback** button to switch to the Video Playback mode.
2. Press the **Menu** button to open the Video Playback menu.
3. Use the **Left/Right Navigation Button** to scroll through the selections until the desired one is highlighted.
4. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.
5. Press the **Menu button** to exit.

3.4.1 Delete One

The Delete One selection allows you to delete individual files.

To delete a file, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired file.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to delete the file.
3. Repeat steps 3-4 to delete other files.
4. Press the **Menu** button to exit.



● **Note:**

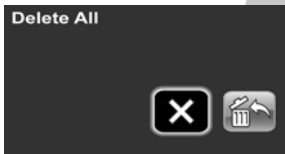
Once deleted, files cannot be recovered. Ensure the files are transferred to the PC via the USB cable or saved to another storage device. Files that have been protected will not be deleted. You have to unlock the files first before deleting them.

3.4.2 Delete All

The Delete All selection allows you to delete all files at once.

To delete all files, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Cancel** or **OK**.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.




● **Note:**

Once deleted, files cannot be recovered. Ensure the files are transferred to the PC via the USB cable or saved to another storage device. Files that have been protected will not be deleted. You have to unlock the files first before deleting them.

3.4.3 Protect


The Protect selection allows you to protect files from being deleted.

To protect a file, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired file.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to lock the file. A lock icon  is displayed on the screen to show that the file is protected.
3. Repeat steps 3-4 to lock other files.



● **Note:**

To unlock a file, repeat the same steps. The lock icon  disappears when the file is unlocked.

3.4.4 Autoplay

The Autoplay selection allows you to play back the recorded files automatically.

To start auto play, please do the following:

1. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to begin auto play.
 - To pause auto play, press the **Down Navigation** button. Press the **Down Navigation** button again to resume.
 - To fast-forward/rewind, press the **Left/Right Navigation** button. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to return to the normal speed.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button again to stop.

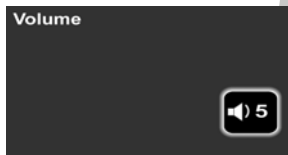


3.4.5 Volume

The Volume selection allows you to adjust the playback volume.

To adjust the volume, please do the following:

1. Use the **Up/Down Navigation** button to adjust the value between 0 and 10.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.



3.5 Shooting Photos

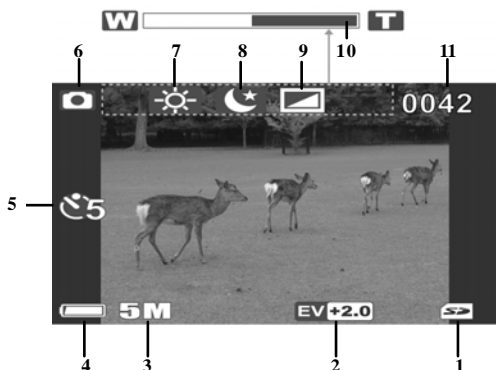
To shoot a photo, please do the following:














1. Press the **Power** button to turn on the video camera.
2. Press the **Mode** button to switch to the Photo mode.
3. Press the **Record** button to capture a photo.

To adjust the camera, you may:

- Use the **T/W** button to zoom in/out.
- Press the **Left Navigation** button to turn the LED flash on/off.
- Toggle the **Right Navigation** button to select different exposure compensation value.

The Photo Shooting Screen



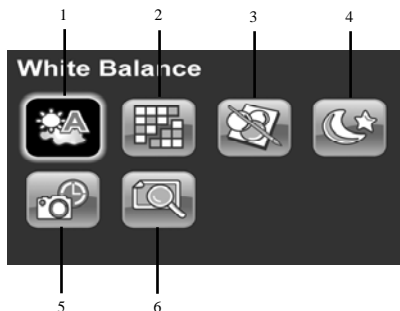

4. Press the **Middle Navigation button** to confirm.
5. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to choose the desired setting and press the **Middle Navigation button** to confirm.
6. Press the **Menu** button to exit.

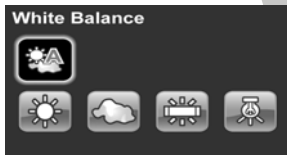

3.6.1 White Balance

The White Balance selection allows you to adjust the white balance when capturing images under specific lighting conditions.

To set the white balance, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired option:
 - **Auto:** Select this option to let the video camera set the white balance automatically.
 - **Sunny:** Select this option for daylight.
 - **Cloudy:** Select this option for cloudy days.
 - **Tungsten:** Select this option for normal indoor lighting conditions.
 - **Fluorescent:** Select this option for fluorescent lighting.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.



3.6.2 Resolution

 - **3M:** Select this option for 2048 x 1536 resolution.
 - **5M:** Select this option for 2592 x 1944 resolution.
 - **12M:** Select this option for 4000 x 3000 resolution.

2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.



3.6.3 Effect

The Effect selection allows you to change the recording effect.

To set the effect, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired option:
 - **Color:** Select this option for color photography.
 - **Sepia:** Select this option for brown color effect.
 - **Black and white:** Select this option for monochrome effect.



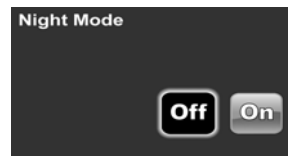
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.

3.6.4 Night Mode

The Night Mode helps you to get better results while shooting at night.

To set the night mode, please do the following:

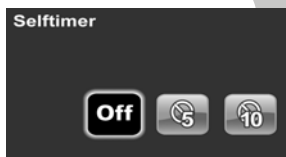
3.6.5 Self-timer

The Self-timer selection allows you to take photos after a pre-defined delay.

- **10 sec.:** Select this option for 10-second delay.
- **Off:** Select this option to disable Self-timer.



2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.

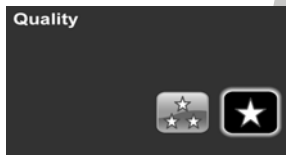
3.6.6 Quality

The Quality selection allows you to set photo qualities. A file in better quality requires more storage space than a file in the normal quality.

To set the photo quality, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Normal** or **Fine**.

- **Normal:** Select this option for normal quality.
- **Fine:** Select this option for high quality.



2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.




3.7 Viewing Photos

To view photos, please do the following:

1. Make sure you are in the Photo mode. Press the **Mode** button to switch to the Photo mode if not.
2. Press the **Playback** button to enter the Photo Playback mode.
3. Press the **Left/Right Navigation** button to browse the recorded photos.
 - Press the **Up Navigation** button to view thumbnails.
 - Select the desired thumbnail and press the **Middle Navigation** button to view the photo in full screen.
4. Press the **Playback** button again to return to the Photo mode.

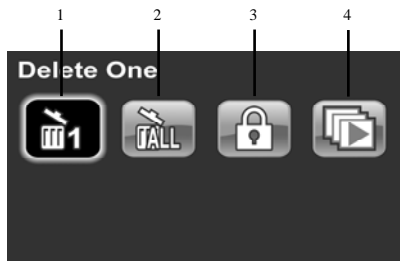

1. In Photo mode, press the **Playback** button to switch to the Photo Playback mode.
2. Press the **Menu** button to open the Photo Playback menu.
3. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to scroll through the selections until the desired one is highlighted.
4. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.
5. Press the **Menu** button again to exit.

The following selections are available in the Photo Playback menu:



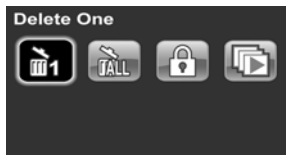

3.8.1 Delete One

The Delete One selection allows you to delete individual files.

To delete a file, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired file.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to delete the file.
3. Repeat steps 3-4 to delete other files.
4. Press the **Menu** button to exit.



● **Note:**

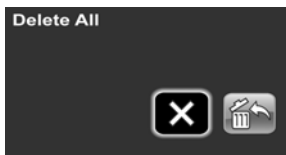
Once deleted, files cannot be recovered. Ensure the files are transferred to the PC via the USB cable or saved to another storage device. Files that have been protected will not be deleted. You have to unlock the files first before deleting them.

3.8.2 Delete All

The Delete All selection allows you to delete all files at once.

To delete all files, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Cancel** or **OK**.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.




● **Note:**

Once deleted, files cannot be recovered. Ensure the files are transferred to the PC via the USB cable or saved to another storage device. Files that have been protected will not be deleted. You have to unlock the files first before deleting them.

3.8.3 Protect


The Protect selection allows you to protect files from being deleted.

To protect a file, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select the desired file.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to lock the file. A lock icon  is displayed on the screen to show that the file is protected.
3. Repeat steps 3-4 to lock other files.



● **Note:**

To unlock a file, repeat the same steps. The lock icon  disappears when the file is unlocked.

3.8.4 Autoplay

The Autoplay selection allows you to play back the recorded files automatically.

To start auto play, please do the following:

1. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to begin auto play.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button again to stop.

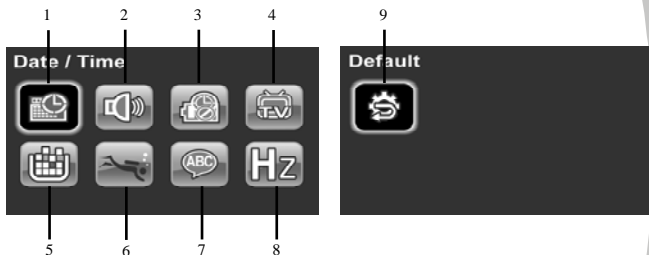

To adjust the auto power off, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select:

- **Off**: Disables the Auto Power Off function.
- **1 min.**: Auto Power Off after 1 minute.
- **5 min.**: Auto Power Off after 5 minutes.



2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.

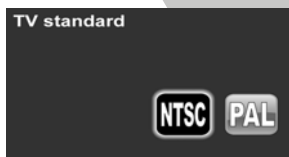
3.9.4 TV Standard

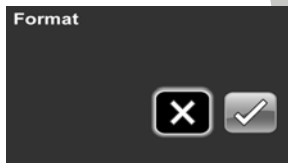


3.9.5 Format

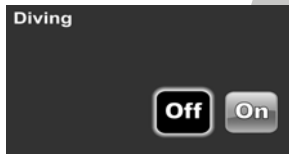

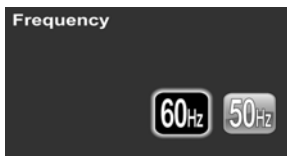

3.9.8 Frequency

To set the refresh rate, please do the following:

2. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.

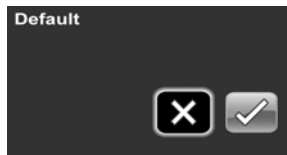


3.9.9 Default

The Default selection allows you to reset the video camera to factory defaults.

To reset, please do the following:

1. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Cancel** or **OK**.
2. Press the **Middle Navigation Button** to confirm.



3.10 USB mode

Your video camera can be used as a USB mass storage device. When connecting to a PC, the video camera is displayed as a removable drive in Windows Explorer. Drag and drop files to and from the removable drive just like any other storage device.

3.11 Diving mode

The Diving mode selection allows you to record videos taking underwater conditions into account. In Diving mode, the video camera will adjust the White Balance setting automatically.

● **Note:**

Except for the White Balance setting, you can adjust all the other video settings just like in the Video mode.

To switch to the Diving mode, please do the following:

1. Press the **Mode** button to switch to the Set mode. The System menu appears.
2. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **Diving**.
3. Press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.
4. Use the **Left/Right Navigation** button to select **On** and press the **Middle Navigation** button to confirm.
5. Press the **Mode** button to exit and enter the Diving mode.
