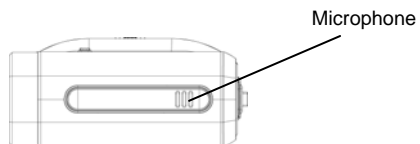
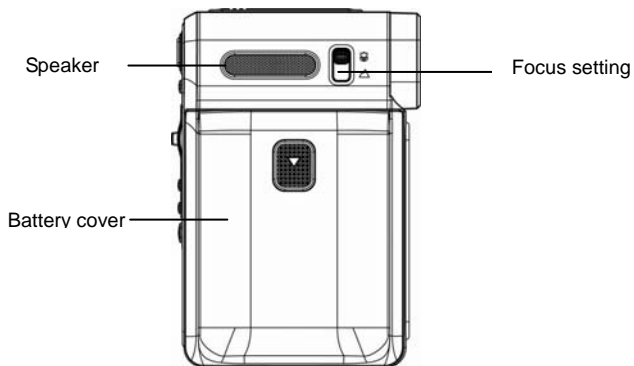
## Front View

## Side View

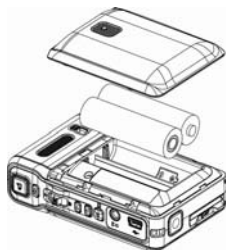


## Getting Started

### Loading the Battery

Before using the camera, you must load two AA (Alkaline) batteries.

1. Follow the arrow direction to slide open the battery cover.
2. Insert the batteries according to the correct polarity marks (+ or -)
3. Close the battery cover firmly.



### Inserting and Removing an SD Card

The camera comes with internal memory (64MB) which allows you to store pictures, movies, recorded voice and music. You can expand the memory capacity by using an optional SD memory card up to 16GB. To insert a memory card:

1. Insert the memory card into the correct position.
2. To remove an installed SD card, press the card inwards to release it.
3. When the card pops out, gently remove it from its slot.

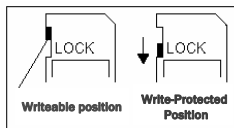


#### NOTE

- When a memory card is being used, movies and pictures are saved on the card rather than on the built-in memory.

### Protecting Data on an SD Card

SD card is read-only by locking the SD card. No pictures, movies and voice can be recorded when the SD card is locked. Make sure the lock is in writeable position before recording any media.





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## Turning the Camera On and Getting Started

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To turn on the camera:

1. Flip out the LCD panel and the camera will turn on automatically.
2. Or you can press the Power Button for one second to turn it on.
  - To take a movie, press the Movie Shutter Button .
  - To take a picture, press the Picture Shutter Button .
  - To record voice, press the OK Button to enter Record Menu. Use Direction Buttons to choose Voice Pen Option. Press Movie Shutter Button to start voice recording.
  - To take movie at HD resolution, press Right Button to switch to HD mode, then press the Movie shutter button.
  - To view stored movies, pictures or listen to Voice recordings and Music, press the RECORD/PLAY button once to switch to Playback Mode. Press it a second time to return to Record Mode.

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## Turning the Camera Off

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To turn off the Camera, you can either press the Power Button for one second, or you can place the LCD panel back to its original position.

## H.264 Movie Recording

Press Movie Shutter button () to start recording. When a movie is recording, a time indicator will display on the LCD monitor. To stop recording, press Movie Shutter

Button () again. Press RECORD/PLAY Button to view the recorded movie.

Four resolution settings are available: HD, D1, VGA, QVGA

## Voice mode

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### To enable voice recording:

4. Choose OK option to enable voice recording and press OK to validate the setting and exit.
5. Press Movie shutter Button to start/stop voice recording.

## Using Digital Zoom

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The digital zoom magnifies the images when recording movies or taking pictures.

1. To zoom in/out, press the Tele/Wide Button.
2. The digital zoom can be set from 1x to 8x and the magnification ratio is shown on the LCD monitor.

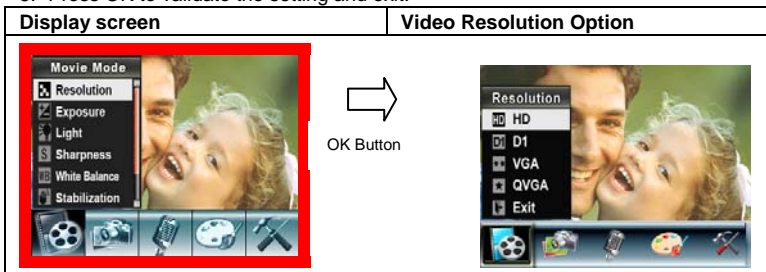

### Movie Resolution

#### To change Movie Resolution:

1. In Movie/Picture Record Mode, press OK to switch to record menu screen.
2. Use Right/Left Buttons to select Movie Mode. The submenu of Movie Mode will appear on the screen.
3. Use (UP/DOWN) Tele/Wide Button to select Resolution then press OK to switch to Resolution submenu.

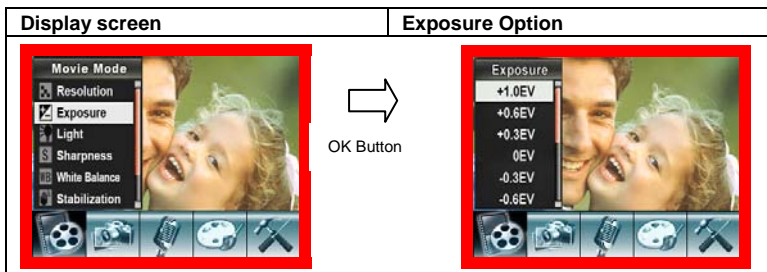

### Exposure

The camera adjusts image exposure automatically. In certain circumstances you may wish to adjust the exposure compensation setting.

**To change Exposure setting:**

1. In Movie/Picture Record Mode, press OK to switch to record menu screen.
2. Use Right/Left Buttons to select Movie Mode. The submenu of Movie Mode will appear on the screen.
3. Use Tele/Wide Button to move to Exposure Option. Press OK and then the Exposure Submenu will pop out on the screen.
4. Use Tele/Wide Button to choose preferred EV value. The change can be previewed immediately.
5. Press OK to validate the setting and exit.

**Light**

There are two flash settings under Movie. To change flash settings, press the hot key (Right Button) or select from the option menu.

## Night Mode

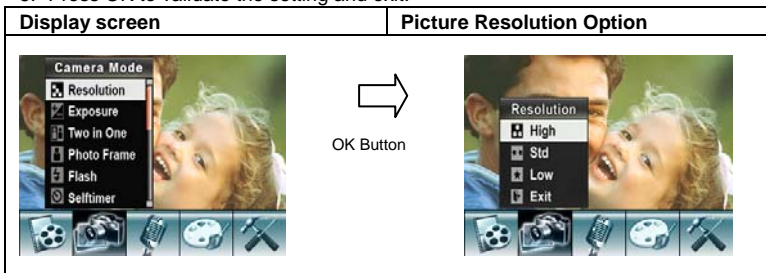

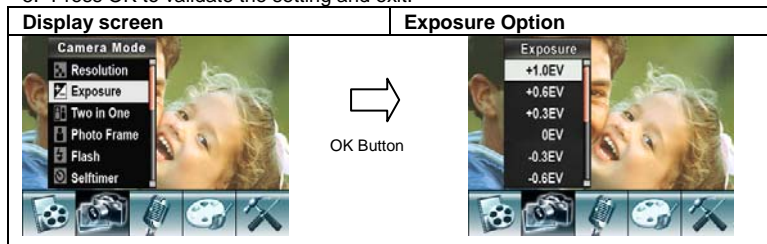

## Exposure

The camera adjusts image exposure automatically. In certain circumstances you may wish to adjust the exposure compensation setting by yourself.

### To change Exposure setting:






1. In Movie/Picture Record Mode, press OK to switch to record menu screen.
2. Use Right/Left Buttons to select Camera Mode. The submenu of Camera Mode will appear on the screen.
3. Use Tele/Wide Button to select Exposure. Press OK and the Exposure submenu will appear on the screen.
4. Use Tele/Wide Button to choose the preferred EV value.
5. Press OK to validate the setting and exit.

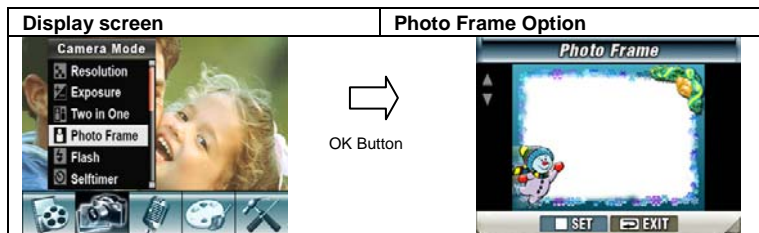

### Photo Frame (Camera Mode Only)

Your camera features a popular electronic photo frame. You can take your picture with a preferred electronic photo frame. **To enable Photo Frame:**

1. In Movie/Picture Record Mode, press OK to switch to record menu screen.
2. Use Right/Left Buttons to select Camera Mode. The submenu of Camera Mode will appear on the screen.
3. Use Tele/Wide Button to select Photo Frame option, then press OK to switch to the Photo Frame submenu.
4. Use Tele/Wide Button to locate the preferred photo frame. Then select the Set option and press OK to validate the setting and exit.



## Flash

This camera has four flash settings under Camera Mode. To change the flash setting, use either the hot key (Right Button) or Option Setting.

1. Auto-flash (A<sup>+</sup>): the flash fires automatically according to light conditions. Use this mode for general photography.
2. Flash On (⚡): The flash will fire for every shot taken.
3. Flash Off (⊗): the flash will not fire under any circumstances. Use this mode when taking images in a place where flash photography is prohibited, or when the subject is distant (beyond the range of the flash).
4. Red-Eye Reduction (⚡): The flash fires twice before the picture is taken.

### To change Flash setting:

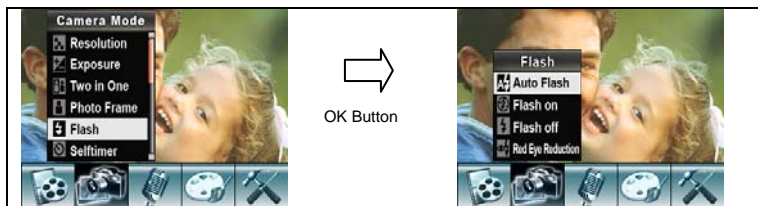
1. In Movie/Picture Record Mode, press OK to switch to record menu screen.
2. Use Right/Left Buttons to select Camera Mode. The submenu of Camera Mode will appear on the screen.
3. Use Tele/Wide Button to select Flash Option, then press OK to switch to the Flash submenu.

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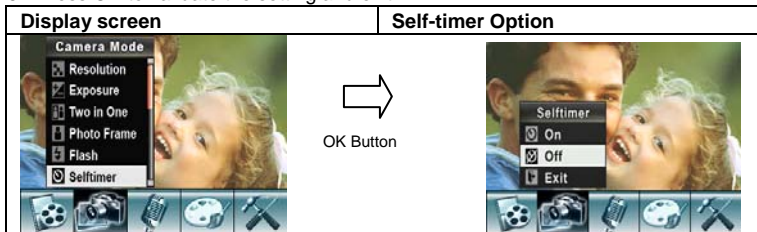


### Self-timer (Camera Mode Only)

The self-timer LED on the front of the camera beneath the flash light will also blink. The speed of the blinking will increase just before the picture is taken.

#### To enable the Self-timer:

1. In Movie/Picture Record Mode, press OK to switch to record menu screen.
2. Use Right/Left Buttons to select Camera Mode. The submenu of Camera Mode will appear on the screen.
3. Use Tele/Wide Button to select Self-timer, then press OK to switch to the Self-timer submenu.
4. Use Tele/Wide Button to choose On or Off.

## Troubleshooting

Refer to the symptoms and measures listed below before sending the digital video camera for repairs. If the problem persists, contact your local reseller or service center.

### Power Supply

Symptom	Cause	Measure
The power does not come on.	The battery is not loaded.	Load the battery correctly.
	The battery is exhausted.	Replace with a new set of batteries.
	The AC power adaptor is not connected correctly.	Reconnect it properly.
The power cuts out during use.	The digital video camera was left unattended and unused, so auto power off cuts it off.	Turn the power back on.
	The battery is exhausted.	Replace with a new set of batteries.
The power does not go off.	Digital video camera malfunction.	Replace with a new set of batteries.
The battery runs out quickly.	It is being used in extreme low temperature.	Don't use this camera under extreme low temperature.
	Many images are being captured in dark places inside, requiring flash.	Prepare extra batteries if you need take a lot of images with flash.
The battery or digital video camera feels warm.	Long period of continuous use of the digital video camera or the flash.	Turn off the camera if you don't use it.

### Shooting

Symptom	Cause	Measure
Even if I press the shutter button, the digital video camera does not shoot.	The battery is running low.	Replace with a new set of batteries.
	The power is not on.	Turn the power on.
	The digital video camera is not in shooting mode.	Slide the mode switch to shooting mode.



Symptom	Cause	Measure
	The shutter button is not pressed all the way.	Press the shutter button all the way.
	The internal memory or memory card does not have any free space.	Load a new memory card, or delete unwanted files.
	End of memory card life.	Load a new memory card.
	The flash is recharging.	Wait until the system LED off.
	The memory card is unrecognized by the digital video camera.	Format the memory card in the digital video camera before its first use or when it was used other than this digital video camera.
	The auto power off function is activated.	Turn the power on again.
Images do not appear on the LCD monitor.	The power is not on.	Turn the power on.
	The LCD monitor is dark.	Adjust the brightness of the LCD monitor in the System Menu.

Symptom	Cause	Measure
Although it is set to Auto Focus, it does not focus.	The lens or Self-timer LED is dirty.	Wipe clean with a soft, dry cloth or lens paper.
	The distance to the subject is smaller than the effective range.	Get your subject within the effective focus range.
The flash does not fire. The flash cannot recharge.	The flash is set to flash off.	Set the flash to something other than flash off mode.

Symptom	Cause	Measure
Even though the flash fired, the image is dark.	The distance to the subject is greater than flash effective range.	Get closer to your subject and capture.
The image is too dark.	The image was captured in a dark place while set to flash off.	Set the flash to something other than flash off mode.
	It is under-exposed.	Set the exposure compensation to a larger value.
The image is too bright.	It is over-exposed.	Set the exposure compensation to a smaller value.
The image lacks natural color.	The image was captured in conditions that are hard for Auto White Balance to adjust to.	Add a white object to the composition.

## Playback

Symptom	Cause	Measure
Cannot playback.	It is not set to playback mode.	Slide the mode switch to playback mode.
The contents of memory card cannot be replayed.	You played back a memory card that was not formatted by this device.	Load a card that was formatted and stored on by this device.
Files cannot be deleted.	The file is protected.	Cancel protection.
	You played back a memory card that was not formatted by this device.	Load a card that was formatted and stored on by this device.
Cannot format a memory card.	The memory card is write-protected.	Remove the write-protection.
	End of memory card life.	Load a new memory card.
The playback image is dark though I used the flash.	The LCD monitor is too dark.	Adjust the brightness of LCD monitor in the System Menu.

## Other Problems

Symptom	Cause	Measure
Cannot load the memory card.	The card is facing the wrong way.	Load correctly.
Even when the digital video camera's buttons are pressed, it does not operate.	The battery is running low.	Replace with a new set of batteries.
	Digital video camera malfunction.	Turn the power off and remove the battery once, and try again.
The date and time is wrong.	The correct date and time is not set.	Set the correct date and time.
The date set has disappeared.	The battery is removed with the power still on.	Set the date and time again.

## About connecting to your computer/software

Symptom	Cause	Measure
Cannot download files.	The free space on the hard disk drive of your computer may be insufficient.	Check whether the hard disk drive has enough space for running Windows, and if the drive for loading files has a capacity at least that of the memory card inserted in the digital video camera.
	No power supply.	Replace with a new set of batteries.
	The USB driver is not installed (for Windows 98/98SE).	Install Device driver.
