## **Photography Terms and Definitions**

Terms	Definitions
auto exposure bracketing (AEB)	A simple technique professional photographers use to ensure they properly expose their pictures, especially in challenging lighting situations. When AEB is selected, the camera automatically takes three or more shots with a different exposure for each frame.
auto focus (AF)	Auto focus refers to a camera lens' ability to adjust its configuration in order to focus properly on a subject regardless of whether it is near or far from the camera. Auto focus lenses generally provide vastly superior image quality than do their fixed focus cousins since they do not have to rely on their depth of field. Also known as: "AF", "auto-focus".
album	An end-user created object that is used to logically group data objects according to some user-defined criteria. An album may or may not be a physical folder in a file system.
Analog to Digital Converter (A/D or ADC)	A circuit that converts an analog signal, having a continuously varying amplitude, to a digitally quantized representation using binary output signals.
aspect ratio	cf. image aspect ratio, pixel aspect ratio.
auto white balance (AWB)	With auto white balance, the camera attempts to determine the color temperature of the light and automatically adjust for that color temperature. Many people just leave the camera set to auto white balance all the time.
Charge Coupled Device (CCD)	A type of silicon integrated circuit used to convert light into an electronic signal.
compression	The process of encoding information using fewer bits cf. image compression, sound file compression.
Digital Print Order Format (DPOF)	A standardized ASCII file created in a digital camera and stored on removable media along with the image files that indicate how many copies of which images should be printed. It also allows index prints, cropping, and text overlays to be specified.

digital still camera (DSC)	A camera incorporating an image sensor which outputs a digital signal representing a still picture, or records a digital signal representing a still picture on a removable medium, such as a memory card or magnetic disk.
dynamic range	cf. ISO DSC dynamic range, colour gamut, luminance ratio.
Exif/JPEG	A compressed file format for digital cameras in which the images are compressed using the baseline JPEG standard, described in ISO 12234-2, and metadata and thumbnail images are stored using TIFF tags within an application segment at the beginning of the JPEG file.
exposure index	A numerical value that is inversely proportional to the exposure provided to an image sensor to obtain an image. Images obtained from a camera using a range of exposure index values will normally provide a range of image quality levels.
ISO speed	A numerical value calculated from the exposure provided at the focal plane of an electronic camera to produce specified camera output signal characteristics using the methods described in the referenced standard. The ISO speed should correlate with the highest exposure index value that provides peak image quality for normal scenes.
JPEG	Joint Photographic Experts Group. An image compression method defined in ISO/IEC 10918-1.
protocol	Defined mechanisms for exchanging data between devices.
StorageID	A device-specific four byte unsigned integer (UINT32) that represents a unique storage area that may contain data objects. The most significant sixteen bits of a StorageID represents the PhysicalStorageID, while the least significant sixteen bits of a StorageID represents the LogicalStorageID.
USB	Universal serial bus, a digital interface for connecting up to 64 devices in a tiered-star topology. See http://www.usb.org.
white balance	The adjustment of electronic still picture color channel gains or image processing so that radiation with relative spectral power distribution equal to that of the scene illumination source is rendered as a visual neutral.

# **Getting Started**

## **Attaching the Wrist Strap**

Follow these instructions to attach the wrist strap to your camera to better protect your new camera:

- Insert the smaller loop of the strap in the strap eyelet.
- 2. Thread the larger loop of the strap though the short loop and pull tight to attach the strap to the camera.



## **Inserting the Battery**

Follow these instructions to insert the NP45 Lithium-ion (Li-ion) battery into the battery compartment. If the battery is already installed, make sure to power off the camera before removing and inserting a recharged or new battery. Please read "Battery Information" before inserting/removing battery.


- 1. If the battery is already installed, make sure to power off the camera before removing and inserting a recharged or new battery.
- 2. Open the battery compartment at the bottom of the camera.



3. Insert the battery into the compartment with the terminal facing inside the camera.



4. Close the battery compartment.




## **Inserting an SD/SDHC Memory Card**

Expand your camera's storage by using SD or SDHC memory cards.

- Open the SD card compartment at the bottom of the camera.
- 2. Insert the SD/SDHC card into the memory card slot with the metallic contacts facing the front side of the camera.
- 3. Push the SD/SDHC card into the memory slot until it clicks into place.
- 4. Close the SD card compartment.





#### To remove the SD/SDHC card

- 1. Open the battery compartment.
- 2. Gently push the card until it clicks and pops out.
- 3. Pull out the card carefully.



## **Charging the battery**

The battery that comes along with your package is not fully charged. You need to charge the battery before using the camera.

- 1. Insert the battery into the battery charger.
- 2. Connect the battery charger to the adaptor.
- 3. Plug the adaptor to the main outlet.



Please charge the battery at least 2.5 hours for the initial use. Beyond the initial use, please charge your battery until the LED indicator on your charger turns green.

## **Camera Memory**

Your camera supports SD cards of up to 4GB in size. It also supports SDHC cards with a maximum capacity of 32GB. If there is a storage card inserted in the memory slot, the camera automatically saves all images, videos and audio clips in the external storage card.



#### **Button \*1: Shooting/Video Record/Playback**

Switch to Shooting, Video Record or Playback mode by using the switching button.

#### **Button \*2: FUNC/Delete**

In Shooting and Video Record mode, press to enter FUNC menu.

In Playback mode, press to delete an image, video or audio clip.

#### **Button \*3: Navigation Control**

The 4-way **Navigation Control** and the SET button allows you to access the various menus available from the On Screen Display (OSD). Further functions of these buttons are as follows:



#### **Button \*4: Menu button**

Press the button to enter the setup/settings menu. Press the button again to exit the settings menu.

## **Initial Settings**

You will be prompted to set up the language and the date and time when the camera is turned on for the first time.

#### **Setting the Language**

- 1. Press or to move through the selection.
- 2. Select a language, and then press (SET) to apply.

#### **Using Setup Menu**

You can access the Setup menu whether you are in Shooting or Playback mode. The Setup menu allows you to configure general camera settings.

### To go to Setup Menu:

- 1. Press to launch the Shooting/Playback Menu.
- 2. Use the or key to change the menu tab to **Setup** menu.
- 3. Use the or pish key to move through the menu selections.
- 4. To select an item, press the SET button or ...
- 5. Change the submenu settings using the 4-way navigation control.
- 6. Press the (SET) button to save and apply settings.



### **Modes**

Your camera has three modes:

### **Shooting mode**



- Set to Shooting mode to capture images and record audio clips.
- Shooting mode can be further set to mode options like auto and scene selection modes.

#### **Video Record mode**



• Set to Video Record mode to record videos.

#### Playback mode



• Set to Playback mode to view or edit photos, review video and audio clips.

#### **Selecting the Shooting mode options**

- 1. Set the camera to Shooting mode.
- 2. Press to launch Shooting mode Menu.
- 3. Select **Shooting Mode**, and then press to enter submenu.
- 4. Select a mode.
- 5. Press the SET button to apply selected mode.



#### **Changing the LCD Monitor Display**

The type of information displayed on the LCD screen can be changed using the button.






- The OSD information may vary depending on the shooting mode type.
- The following icons, if enabled, are still displayed on the LCD even when OSD off or Guide lines on: AEB, Face tracking, Self-Timer/Burst, and Macro.
- Use the "Guide lines" to properly set image for capture. Typically, these guide lines are used to help vertical and horizontal alignment of the photograph.

In Playback mode, the LCD display can be changed into any of the following:

# **Using Shooting Functions**

## **Shooting Image**

### **Taking Photos**

- Turn on the camera by pressing the button.
- 2. Frame the shot using the focus bracket on the LCD monitor. See Image 1.
- 3. Press the shutter button half-way down. The camera automatically adjusts the focus and exposure. When the camera is ready to take the photo, the frame bracket turns green, the shutter speed and aperture value are displayed See Image 2.
- 4. Fully press the button to capture image.



When the shake warning icon opening appears, hold the camera steadily.

### **Using the Stabilizer**

The Stabilizer function helps reduce blurred images caused by shaking.

- 1. Enable the Stabilizer in the Setup Menu as described on page 32.
- 2. Use the or keys to go through the selection.
- 3. Press the SET button to save and apply changes.




 If Stabilizer is enabled, the stabilizer icon is displayed on the LCD monitor and the ISO setting is automatically set to Auto.

## **Setting the Zoom Control**

Your camera features up to 5X optical zoom and up to 5X digital zoom. Optical zoom is achieved by mechanically adjusting the lens. While digital zoom is activated through the menu settings.

#### **Zoom buttons**



#### To adjust Digital Zoom options:

- 1. Press in shooting mode, and activate digital zoom, see Image.
- 2. Activate digital zoom.
- 3. Press the **T** button to optically zoom in to the maximum until it stops.
- 4. Release the button.
- 5. Press the **T** button again to switch to digital zoom automatically. Zooming continues.






## To adjust Optical Zoom:

- 1. Press the to zoom in out.
- 2. The zoom indicator appears on the LCD monitor 255.0.



Digital zoom is not activated in recording video.

#### **Using Flash**

When taking pictures in difficult lighting conditions, use the button to get correct exposure. This function cannot be activated in recording video or continuous shooting.



Flash function is only available in shooting still images but not available in Burst and AEB modes.

#### **Setting the Focus Mode**

To set the Focus mode:

• Press the button repeatedly until the desired focus mode icon is displayed on the lower left corner of the LCD monitor.




Your camera supports the four focus modes:

**Normal.** With normal focus, the focus range starts from .8 meters ( $\sim 2 \frac{1}{2}$  feet). When the camera is set to normal mode, there is no icon displayed on the screen.

Macro. This mode is designed for close-up photography. If Macro is enabled, you can capture the detail and sharpness of a very close image.

**PF** Pan Focus. The camera focuses on every object.

**INF Infinity.** The camera focuses on distant objects.




# **Using the Function Menu**

The " Fin " is used to enter the My Menu mode for a quick setup of the latest six shooting/ scene modes that were selected.




- Press to launch the My Menu mode.
- Press again to close the menu.
- The My Menu options bar (as shown in the image to the right) displays the last six shooting/scene modes that were selected.
- The Menu bar (as shown in the image to the right) displays the available options for each selected shooting/scene mode.




#### **Shooting Mode**

#### Resolution


The Resolution setting is used to set the resolution before you capture the image. The higher the resolution, the more memory space is required.



#### Quality


The quality setting lets you adjust the quality level of your photos before you capture them. However, the higher the quality, the more memory space is required in your memory card. The available settings for still images are as follows:






#### **EV Compensation**

In extreme lighting condition, the auto exposure function may not set for the correct exposure for optimal picture quality. The manual 0 EV option allows you to adjust the exposure value to the desired level. Available for still images only.





#### **White Balance**

The White Balance setting allows you to adjust the image color temperature according to the ambient light condition when recording the still images and video.




Icon	Item	Description
AWB	Auto	The camera automatically adjusts the white balance.
*	Sun	Ideally used for bright sunny conditions.
	Cloudy	Ideally used for cloudy conditions.
-; <b>.</b>	Tungsten	Ideally used for indoor photos with tungsten or halogen lighting without a flash.
M	Fluorescent H	Ideally used for indoor photos with blue-tinted fluorescent lighting.
兴	Fluorescent L	Ideally used for indoor photos with red-tinted fluorescent lighting.
Ų	Manual	Used when light source cannot be specified. Press the shutter button for the camera to be pointed at a white object and adjust the appropriate white balance setting automatically according to the environment.

#### **ISO**

The ISO function lets you adjust the ISO sensitivity in recording still images depending on the lightning levels of your surroundings.

- Use a higher ISO setting in dim conditions and a lower ISO setting in brighter conditions.






#### - Using Smile Capture Mode

The Smile Capture mode uses smile tracking to automatically capture images. This feature is most useful in capturing different angles and smiles of moving people. When capturing an image with more than one person, the camera detects the smile of the closest person on the center of the screen.

- 1. Select from the Scene Mode submenu.
- 2. Focus the camera on the subject to capture.




#### **Setting the Date & Time Imprint**

Enabling the Date & Time Imprint function will add the recorded date and time on photos.

The recording date and time are based on the camera's clock settings. Once date and time are imprint on a photo, they can no longer be edited or deleted. Limitations of Date & Time Imprint functions are as follows:

- · Available for still images only.
- May slow down AEB/ continuous shooting when Date & Time Imprint is enabled in /AEB/ Burst mode.
- If Date & Time Imprint is enabled, digital zoom is automatically turned off.

#### **Recording Videos**

You can record videos with the camera, the available recording time depends on the capacity of the memory card. Videos can be recorded until the maximum memory capacity has been reached.








- When the maximum capacity for a single video has been reached, simple press the shutter button again to continue recording.

#### **Setting the Video Quality**

The Video Quality function icon appears only in Video Record. Press the button to bring up the video quality options as shown below. Use this function to adjust the resolution and quality of video clips.

#### YouTube Mode

The YouTube Mode allows you to record videos with predefined video settings for easy upload to the YouTube website.

YouTube supports two file upload standards:

- Single File Uploaded. The maximum video file size is up to 100 MB.
- YouTube Uploaded. The maximum video file size is up to 1 GB.

Most uploaded video lengths range 1 to 5 minutes. Therefore when recording video using the YouTube mode, the following applies:

- Recorded videos are set to YouTube standard resolution of 640 X 480.
- Recording automatically stops when the file reaches 100 MB.

Recorded videos in the YouTube mode are stored following the DCF rule, however videos are saved in a specific folder named "\_UTUBE".

• To record a YouTube videos, select from the Video Quality function. Available recording time for a YouTube is up to 10 minutes.

#### **Recording Voices**

- From the Shooting mode menu, select Voice.
   The Voice Recording screen layout is displayed on the LCD monitor.
- 2. Press the button to start recording.
- 3. Press the button again to stop recording.





Voice recording will automatically stop when the maximum memory capacity is full.







# **Playing Voice Recording**

#### **Deleting an Photo/Video/Audio**



#### **Protect**

The Protect function lets you lock a photo or video to protect it from being modified or accidentally erased. A protected file has a lock icon when viewed on Playback mode.

#### To protect files:


The function allows you to trim an photo to another image size. This function is only available for still images.

#### To trim an image:

- 1. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- 2. Use the or key to scroll and select an image to trim.
- 3. Press the button to launch the Playback menu.



- 4. Select Crop. The Trim screen layout is displayed on the LCD monitor.
- 5. Use the control to change size. Use the navigation controls to move the position of the trimmed area.



6. Press the (SET) to save changes to the photo.

- 7. Three options are displayed. If Overwrite is selected, the original photo will permanently change to reflect the changes. If Saved changes is selected, a new photo file will be created leaving the original photo as is.
- 8. Select Cancel to abort any edits that were made and to exit the Crop function.



- Crop function is not available for photos with image size set to 3:2, 16:9, and VGA.
- All images will be trimmed in 4:3 ratio regardless of its original image ratio.

#### Resize

The Resize function allows you to change the photo resolution of large images to smaller ones. This function is only available for still images.

#### To resize an image:

- 1. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- Use the key to scroll and select an image to resize.
- 3. Press the button to launch the Playback menu.
- Select Resize. The Resize submenu is displayed on the LCD monitor.
- Select size among: 8M, 5M, 3M, and VGA. Available size settings may vary depending on original image size. Unavailable settings appear as gray icons in Resize submenu.



- 6. After selecting size, a menu selection appears. Select whether to:
  - Overwrite. Save and replace the old file with the new one.
  - Save Changes. Save the new file as a new one.
  - Cancel. Cancel resize.
- 7. Press the SET button to save/cancel changes.




Resize function is not available for photos with image size set to 3:2, 16:9, and VGA.


#### **DPOF**

The Digital Print Order Format (DPOF) function allows you to mark image in your memory card for printing and allows you to specify the number of copies that you want to print at a later date. When all images to be printed are marked, take the memory card to a digital printing service, or use a DPOF compatible printer.

#### To set DPOF:



- Select **DPOF**. The submenu appears. Available settings are as follows:
  - **This Image.** Select a single image to mark.
  - All. Mark all images in the memory card.
  - **Reset.** Reset all DPOF settings to initial default settings.






You can specify up to 99 copies for DPOF. If you specify 0 copies, the DPOF setting of that image is automatically disabled.

#### **PictBridge**

The PictBridge function allows you to print images captured by your camera without connecting the camera to a PC. Print images with a PictBridge compatible printer directly.

#### To activate PictBridge:

Connect your camera to a PictBridge compatible printer using the USB cable. See illustration below.






If the printer does not support date & time imprint, the date & time imprint function will be disabled in PictBridge.

# Making Connections Connecting the Camera to a PC

You can transfer photos, videos and audio files to your PC.


- 1. Connect the camera to a PC using the USB cable.
- 2. Turn on the camera.
- The PC detects the connection. The internal memory of camera and memory card display as removable drives in the file manager. No image is displayed on the LCD monitor.



#### **Connecting the Camera to a Printer**

You can print your photos directly using a PictBridge compatible printer.

- 1. Turn on your camera.
- 2. Set PictBridge settings.
- 3. Connect the camera to the printer using the USB cable.



## **Troubleshooting**

Problem	Cause and/or Action			
Camera does not turn on.	The battery may be exhausted. Charge or replace the battery.			
Camera turns off automatically.	Press any button except the Power button to turn on the camera.			
LCD turns blank.	Press any button except the Power button to turn on the LCD.			
Empty battery icon is displayed on the LCD, and then the camera turns off.	Battery is exhausted, please replace or recharge.			
LCD screen displays 'No images in memory'.	The image file on the memory card. Image file format may not be supported.			
LCD screen displays 'Not available for this file'.	Function is only available for specific file types. File format is not supported.			
LCD screen displays 'Memory full'.	Memory card is full. Replace the memory card with a new one or delete unnecessary images.			
LCD screen displays 'File locked'	This file is locked. Unlock the file.			
LCD screen displays 'Card locked'.	The memory card is protected. Remove the card and slide the write-protect switch to it's unlock position.			
LCD screen displays 'CARD HAS WRONG FORMAT'.	The memory card is protected. Remove the card and slide the write-protect switch to it's unlock position.			
LCD screen displays 'Copy error'.	The memory card is protected. Remove the card and slide the write-protect switch to it's unlock position. The memory card is full. Replace card or delete unnecessary files.			
The lens is extended and will NOT retract.	Do not force the lens to go back. The type of the battery used may be incorrect or the battery power level is too low. Change the battery or charge the battery before using the camera.
