Before Using an au Phone

- You cannot receive or make calls in a location where the signal cannot be received, even within the service area. Calling may not be available in a location where the signal is weak. If you move to a location where the signal is weak during a call, the call may be interrupted.
- The au phone is a digital cell phone and can maintain a high call quality until the signal weakness reaches its limit. Therefore, once the limit has been reached, the call may be disconnected suddenly.
- Note that the au phone uses signals which may be intercepted by a third party. (However, the CDMA/GSM system enables highly confidential call communications.)
- The au phone is a wireless station which is compliant with the Radio Act, and may be subject to inspections regulated by the Radio Act.
- When you insert the au IC-Card, the product number information of your au phone is sent to the au server for the security and operation status notification of the au phone.
- Always be considerate of others around you when using your au phone in public places.
- For a child's use, read the Basic Manual and give your child instructions on proper use.
- The INFOBAR A01 is a cell phone compatible with the international roaming service. Each network service which is described in the Basic Manual varies depending on the area or service. For details, refer to supplied Global Passport Owner's Guide (Japanese).

Introduction

Cell Phone Etiquette

Cell phones always emit weak radio waves when power is on. Use cell phones in an enjoyable and safe manner without forgetting to be considerate of others around you.

Use of cell phones is not allowed in some places.

- · Using a cell phone while driving a car/motorcycle is dangerous and is prohibited by law. Also, using a cell phone while riding a bicycle may be punished by law.
- Using a cell phone in an aircraft is prohibited.

Be considerate of where you use the cell phone and how loudly you talk.

Do not make calls in theaters, museums, libraries, and other similar places. Turn power off or turn on manner mode so as not to disturb others around you by ring tones.


- Do not use the cell phone on a street where you might interrupt the flow of pedestrians.
- Move to areas where you will not inconvenience others on trains or in hotel lobbies
- · Refrain from talking in a loud voice.
- Obtain the permission of other people before you take their photos with the cell phone's camera.

Be considerate of people around you.

- · Some people close to you in crowded places such as packed trains may be using a cardiac pacemaker. Turn the cell phone off in such places.
- · Abide by the rules of hospitals and other medical institutions where it is forbidden to use or carry cell phones.





Security Code and Passwords

You have to use each security code for using the INFOBAR A01. You can use a security code and other passwords described below. Take care not to forget your security code and passwords because they are required for performing various operations and using subscription services.

PIN Code

If the PIN code is incorrectly entered three times consecutively, the PIN code will be locked. Use the PUK code to unlock the PIN code.

PIN Code

You can set the INFOBAR A01 to require PIN code entry every time the power is turned on, to prevent unauthorized use of the au IC-Card by a third party.

- At the time of purchase, the PIN code is not to be required to use phone. On the iida Home, tap Settings → Location & security
 - \rightarrow Set up UIM card lock \rightarrow Mark Lock UIM card to set the PIN code to be required.

The PIN code is also required when setting Lock UIM card.

- The initial setting of the PIN code is "1234". On the iida Home, tap Settings \rightarrow Location & security \rightarrow Set up UIM card lock
 - \rightarrow Change UIM PIN to change the PIN code to a four- to eight- digit number.

PUK Code

Enter the PUK code when the PIN code is locked.

- PUK code is an eight-digit number given at the time of purchase, and is printed on the back side of the plastic card where your au IC-Card is attached.
- When you enter the PUK code, set the new PIN code with *Change UIM PIN*.
- If the PUK code is incorrectly entered ten times consecutively, contact an au shop, PiPit or the Customer Service Center.
- When the PIN code is locked, the INFOBAR A01 may be restarted for the security reasons.

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
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Names and Functions of Parts



1 O Power key

Turns on/off the power, and sets/disables sleep mode.

Volume up/down key

Adjusts volume.

Hold down on the unlock screen, to enable/disable manner mode.

3 D Search key

Use it to display the Quick Search Box etc.

④ Earpiece (Receiver)

Emits voice of other party during a call, messages in Answering memo, etc.

⑤ Charging/Incoming indicator, Light sensor

Illuminates in red while charging.

Flashes according to the settings when receiving a call or mail message.

Light sensor detects the ambient brightness and adjusts the brightness of display.

Internal antennas

Do not cover the internal antennas with your hand when you call, use the Internet, Wi-Fi or Bluetooth® or retrieve GPS information.

- Display
- (8) Menu key

Displays the option menu.

(9) Mouthpiece (Microphone)

Transmits your voice to the other party during a call. It is also used for recording sounds. Take care not to cover the microphone with your fingers etc.

10 Home key

Use it to display the iida Home etc.

1 BACK Back key

Returns to the previous screen.

② External connection jack

Use it to connect the INFOBAR A01 to the microUSB- 3.5ϕ conversion cable, the common AC adapter 03 (sold separately), the microUSB cable 01 (sold separately), the 18 pin-microUSB conversion adapter 01 (sold separately), the microUSB stereo earphone conversion adapter 01 (sold separately), etc.

- 13 External connection jack cover
- ① Camera lens
- 15 Speaker

Emits ring tones, alarm tones, etc.

- 16 Battery pack cover
- 1 FeliCa mark

Hold it over a reader/writer when using Osaifu-Keitai[®]. Sends and receives data via IC communication.

18 Infrared port

Sends and receives data via infrared communication.

- 19 Mobile light
- 20 Lock slider

Locks/Unlocks the battery pack.

- microSD memory card slot
- 2 Reset button

If operations become unstable or unavailable, press the reset button with a pointed end of an object for at least two seconds to restart the INFOBAR A01. Restarting with the reset button does not delete any saved data or application.

- 24 Battery pack

Charging the Battery Pack

The battery pack is not fully charged at the time of purchase. Charge the battery pack when you use the INFOBAR A01 for the first time or the battery level becomes low. Charging is finished when the red charging/incoming indicator goes out.

- When the battery pack has less than approximately 15 percent of the battery level, the message *Please connect charger* appears on the screen. Charge the battery pack after tapping *OK*, or exchange it for another one fully charged.
- Be sure to close the external connection jack cover securely, and do not pull or twist it forcefully.


Charging the Battery Pack with the Specified AC Adapter (sold separately)/DC Adapter (sold separately)

The followings are the explanation of how to connect the common AC adapter 03 (sold separately)/the common DC adapter 03 (sold separately) to charge.

Charging time is as shown below.



 These times are based on the case when you use the common AC adapter 03 (sold separately)/ the common DC adapter 03 (sold separately). Open the external connection jack cover of the INFOBAR A01.

Insert the microUSB plug of the common AC adapter 03 (sold separately)/the common DC adapter 03 (sold separately) to the external connection jack of the INFOBAR A01. Plug the common AC adapter 03 (sold separately) power plug into a 100 V AC power outlet/Plug the common DC adapter 03 (sold separately) plug into a cigarette lighter socket.

Charging/Incoming indicator illuminates in red, and 🖬 appears. When charging is finished, the charging/incoming indicator goes out.

 Charging is available by connecting the INFOBAR A01 to a PC with the microUSB cable 01 (sold separately). On the iida Home, tap Settings → USB connection → Mark USB battery charge to enable the setting.

Turning the Power On/Off

Turning the Power On

Hold down 🕜 for at least two

seconds.

The unlock screen is displayed. Slide ♥ to ● to unlock. Precautions on inserting or removing the microSD memory card appear each time the power is turned on.



(Unlock screen)

 The initial setting of the touch panel is executed while the logo is displayed after the power is turned on. Do not touch the screen, otherwise touch panel operations may not be performed properly.

Turning the Power Off

Hold down 🕐 for at least two seconds.

The phone options screen is displayed.

If you hold down (b) on the unlock screen, the power is turned off without the phone options screen being displayed.

Power off $\rightarrow OK$.

Restarting the INFOBAR A01

Turn off the INFOBAR A01 once and restart.

Hold down 🕑 for at least two seconds.

The phone options screen is displayed.

$2 Reboot \rightarrow OK.$

Sleep Mode

If you press on no operation is made for a while, the screen is turned off temporarily, and then sleep mode is set. You can disable sleep mode if you execute the following operation.

(d) while sleep mode is set.

The unlock screen is displayed.

- In some applications in use, the screen which was displayed before sleep mode is set may be displayed when sleep mode is disabled.
- Do not touch the screen when you display the screen by pressing the power key during sleep mode. Otherwise touch panel operations may not be performed properly.

Switching the Display Language to English

You can switch the display language for function names and other items to English.

Initial Setup

After you purchase the INFOBAR A01, the initial setup screen is displayed automatically when turning on the power or inserting another's au IC-Card.

For detailed operations on the initial setup, refer to the supplied Setting Guide (Japanese).

- Set Date & time → Next.
- **2** Set Location \rightarrow Next.

3 Set Other.

Set Wi-Fi settings, au one-ID setting, Google account, Text font or Profile settings.

If you tap No, the initial setup screen is not displayed from the next startup.

Alternatively, on the iida Home, tap Settings → Default settings to set up.

Removing/Attaching the Battery Pack

Removing the Battery Pack

When removing the battery pack, turn off the INFOBAR A01.

Remove the battery pack cover on the back of the INFOBAR A01.

Hook a fingertip (nail) on the concave portion with the center of the battery pack cover pressed (1-1), and then remove the battery pack cover by pulling up in the direction of the arrow (1-2).





2 Unlock the battery pack.

Slide the lock slider in the direction of the arrow.



Remove the battery pack.

Remove the battery pack by holding the protruding edge and lifting it upward.




 When removing the battery pack, always pull up on the protruding edge. Doing otherwise may result in damage to the INFOBAR A01 or the battery contacts.

Attaching the Battery Pack

Use the specified battery pack for the INFOBAR A01 and attach it properly.

Align the contacts on the battery pack with those of the INFOBAR A01 and then insert the battery pack securely with the protruding edge facing up on the battery pack.



Lock the battery pack.

Slide the lock slider in the direction of the arrow.



After attaching the battery pack cover, press the battery pack cover while tracing the periphery of it, and make sure that it is closed properly.

Trace the battery pack cover, starting from the center of the right side.



- Before attaching the battery pack, make sure that the au IC-Card is inserted properly.
- Failure to follow the correct procedure when attaching the battery pack may result in damage to the battery pack or the battery pack cover.

au IC-Card

An au IC-Card records your personal information au IC-Card such as phone numbers.




· Confirm the correct direction when you insert the au IC-Card.

Removing au IC-Card

Turn off the power and remove the battery pack before removing or inserting the au IC-Card.


Remove the tray straight out by pulling the tab of it and remove the au IC-Card.




Inserting au IC-Card

- Remove the tray straight out by pulling the tab of it.
- Attach the au IC-Card on the tray with the IC (metal surface) side down.

Adjust the orientation of the cutout of the au IC-Card to that of the tray, and attach the au IC-Card by sliding it onto the tray.






Confirm that the au IC-Card is caught by three ribs of the tray.



Insert the tray into the INFOBAR A01.



Using microSD Memory Card

You can set microSD memory card (including microSDHC memory card) to the INFOBAR A01, and save data. And also you can save address book, mail messages, bookmarks, etc. in microSD memory card.

- Some applications may not be available when a microSD memory card is not inserted.
- The maximum file size available on a microSD memory card is 2 GB per file when saving data to microSD memory card.
- A microSD memory card initialized on other devices may not be used on the INFOBAR A01 property. Initialize it on the INFOBAR A01. For operations to initialize the microSD memory card, refer to "Initializing microSD Memory Card".
- For operations to play/display data in the microSD memory card, refer to "Playing/Displaying Data" and "Using Menu in the Contents Screen".
- Some files such as copyright protected data may not be played on the INFOBAR A01 even if they are moved/copied from the PC etc. to a microSD memory card successfully.

Handling Precautions

- Do not remove microSD memory card or the battery pack and do not turn off the INFOBAR A01 and other equipment while reading, writing, playing, saving or moving/copying data. It may result in damage to data in the INFOBAR A01 or microSD memory card or data loss.
- Do not drop or subject the INFOBAR A01 to vibration or impact with a microSD memory card inserted. It may result in damage to recorded data or data loss.
- Do not insert objects other than microSD memory card such as liquid, metals or flammable items into the microSD memory card slot. It may result in a fire, electric shock or malfunction.
- Do not apply excessive force to open or close the microSD memory card slot.
- The following microSD memory cards have been confirmed for operation based on the criteria by au. For operation confirmation results of other microSD memory cards, contact each microSD memory card manufacturer.



Removing microSD Memory Card

- Turn off the INFOBAR A01 and remove the battery pack cover.
- Slide the microSD memory card slot in the direction of the arrow to unlock.



Open the microSD memory card slot and remove the microSD memory card.

Slowly pull the microSD memory card straight out.


4 Close the microSD memory card slot and slide it in the direction of the arrow to lock.

5 Attach the battery pack cover.

- · Do not touch the terminal part of microSD memory card.
- Do not remove the microSD memory card forcefully. It may result in damage to the microSD memory card or the INFOBAR A01 or data loss.
- Application installed to microSD memory card cannot be used once you removed microSD memory card.
- The microSD memory card may be warm after a long time use. It is normal.

Inserting microSD Memory Card

- Turn off the INFOBAR A01 and remove the battery pack cover.
- 2 Slide the microSD memory card slot in the direction of the arrow to unlock.



- Open the microSD memory card slot, confirm the direction of the terminal side of the microSD memory card and slowly insert it straight into the slot.
- 4 Close the microSD memory card slot slowly and slide it in the direction of the arrow to lock.
- 5 Attach the battery pack cover.
- Insert a microSD memory card with the right side up in the appropriate direction.

Inserting a microSD memory card forcefully into the slot could result in failure to remove the microSD memory card or damage to the microSD memory card or the INFOBAR A01.

· Do not insert the microSD memory card too deeply when attaching it.

Operating the Touch Panel

The display of the INFOBAR A01 is a touch panel. You can operate the INFOBAR A01 by directly touching the screen.

Tap/Double-Tap

Tap: Gently touch a screen and then immediately release your finger. Double-tap: Tap quickly twice on the same position.



Main purpose of this operation

Select an item or icon displayed on the screen. Double-tap to enlarge/reduce the screen.

Long-Touch

Keep touching an item or key.

Main purpose of this operation Display context menu etc.

Slide

Gently touch a screen and then trace it to the desired direction.

Main purpose of this operation

Scroll screen or switch pages. In addition, operate gauge and bar when adjusting volume and brightness.



Flick

Touch a screen and then quickly flick your finger up, down, left or right.

■ Main purpose of this operation Switch pages or enter characters by flick input.

Pinch

Touch a screen with two of your fingers and then move them apart or closer together.

Main purpose of this operation Enlarge/Reduce the screen.

Drag

Gently touch a screen and then trace it to the desired position.

Main purpose of this operation

Move an icon on the screen to the desired position.







Learning the Basics

Learning the Basics

iida Home and widget Home

Home consists of two screens which are the iida Home and widget Home. You can paste applications, shortcuts, etc. on the iida Home and you can paste widgets on the widget Home.

Flick the screen to the left/right to switch the iida Home and widget Home. Also, slide the iida Home or widget Home to up/down to scroll the screen or switch pages.

Viewing the iida Home

Applications, shortcuts, etc. are displayed in panels. The panels are positioned section by section. Select a panel to activate the application.

- 1) Status bar
- 2 Application/Shortcut panel
- Section bar

Displays a section title and classifies the section. Long-touch a section bar to display the section bar list. Drag it to any section bar and release your finger to scroll the iida Home to the selected section bar position.

④ Bottom key

Operate with the same method as section bar.

- ⑤ Opening/Closing section key
- 6 Panel operation key

While the key is displayed on the enlarged panel, tap the key to operate the displayed contents of the panel.

Using Status Bar

The notification indicators to notify you of a missed call, a new mail message or a running operation are displayed on the left side of the status bar, while the status indicators to show the status of the INFOBAR A01 are on the right side.

Also, tap the status bar to display the notification/status panel.

Using Notification/Status Panel

In the notification/status panel, you can check the details on notification indicators and status indicators or activate an application corresponding to the indicator.


You can also set manner mode, VeilView, etc.

1 Power control

You can set Wi-Fi, Bluetooth[®], GPS, auto-sync, and brightness of screen. You can save power by switching the settings frequently when you do not use functions.

Notification area

- In this manual, operation to tap More is not described for option menu.

Context Menu

The context menu is displayed by long-touching an item or a display where the menu is available.




Flick input

When the software keyboard is "12 Key", you can enter a desired character by flicking the key up, down, left or right without tapping the key repeatedly.

By long-touching a key, the candidates that can be entered by flicking entry are displayed. By flicking the key in the direction of a desired character being displayed, the character is entered in the character entry area. For example, you can enter "A" by only tapping and you can enter "B" by flicking and left.



- The INFOBAR A01 may be warm after displaying the photo monitor screen or operating repeated movie recordings for a long time. Be careful of touching for a long time which may result in a low temperature burn.
- If you use the INFOBAR A01 camera in a wrongful manner, you may be subject to punishment according to laws of the national and local governments.

- No communication charges apply for watching TV (1Seg). However, when you use an additional service using packet communication on a data broadcast etc., packet communication charges apply.
- Be careful not to watch TV (1Seg) for a long time at a loud volume. It may harm your hearing.

Behavior by Battery Level

 If the battery level becomes (approximately 10 %) or lower while activating TV (1Seg), it is terminated automatically. If the battery level becomes so while recording TV programs, the recorded content is saved and TV (1Seg) ends.


TV antenna


Using Global Passport CDMA/GSM

GLOBAL PASSPORT

Global passport is the international roaming service which allows the INFOBAR A01 used in Japan to be available overseas as it is. You can use the INFOBAR A01 via either GSM network or CDMA network according to your travel destination.

- You can make a call via GSM network or CDMA network around the globe with your usual phone number.
- Because International call charges are billed together with call charges in Japan without any additional application or daily/monthly call charges, you can pay simply. For details of the countries where global passport GSM/global passport CDMA is available, call charges, the contents of the service, etc., refer to the Global Passport Owner's Guide (Japanese) or check them on the au homepage or at Customer Service Center.
 - GSM is an acronym of Global System for Mobile Communications. This is one of the wireless communication systems applied to digital cell phones and widely used around the globe such as in Europe, America, Asia, Oceania and Africa. GSM does not support CDMA, PDC, etc. applied in Japan.
 - The international roaming service is a service which enables voice calls etc. with your phone or phone number of au used in Japan via cell phones carrier's networks overseas.

- If an au IC-Card is stolen or lost, the card may be inserted into another mobile phone (including GSM mobile phone for overseas use) by a third party. So, it is recommended to set the PIN code to protect from improper use by a third party.

When the INFOBAR A01 is Stolen or Lost

- If the INFOBAR A01 is lost or stolen while overseas, please contact Customer Service Center immediately to suspend phone service.
 Please be aware that any calling charges and packet communication charges incurred after theft or loss of a phone are the responsibility of the customer.
- If the au IC-Card inserted into the INFOBAR A01 is stolen or lost, the card may be inserted into another mobile phone (including GSM mobile phone for overseas use) by a third party. So, it is recommended to set the PIN code to protect from improper use by a third party.

Using the INFOBAR A01 Properly by Knowing About Calling and Communication Services Overseas

- Calling charges differ depending on the country/region.
- Discount services do not apply to calling charges incurred while overseas.
- Calling charges are also incurred when receiving calls overseas.
- Depending on the country/region, calling charges may be incurred from the time that you tap *Call*.

Configuring the Overseas Settings

To use the INFOBAR A01 overseas, you are required to change to the telecommunications carrier's networks that you connect to at your travel destination.

Obtaining the PRL (Roaming Area Information)

The PRL (roaming area information) contains information on roaming areas of overseas partner providers who have signed an international roaming contract with KDDI (au).

You need to set the PRL when using the INFOBAR A01 in the CDMA network areas. Please obtain the latest PRL before traveling.

I On the iida Home, Settings \rightarrow Wireless & networks

- → Mobile networks → Roaming settings → PRL settings
- → Update PRL version.

The PRL is obtained. Download the PRL data by following the on-screen instructions.

- · When you download the PRL data, packet communication charges apply.
- Be aware that service may be unavailable in some areas if you do not update the PRL.

Setting the Area

You can set the area where you use the INFOBAR A01.

On the iida Home, Settings \rightarrow Wireless & networks

 \rightarrow Mobile networks \rightarrow Roaming settings \rightarrow Area settings.

• The country selection screen may be displayed if *Area settings* is set to other than *Japan*. Select the travel country.

Setting the network

You can search and connect to the available networks when the international roaming begins or a network being used is out of service area.

- On the iida Home, Settings \rightarrow Wireless & networks
 - → Mobile networks → Roaming settings
 - → Network operators.

The available networks are searched and displayed.

2 Select the network to use.

When you tap *Search networks*, the available networks are searched. When you tap *Select automatically*, the optimized network is automatically set.

· This service is available only while the GSM network is used.

Setting the data roaming

You can use the packet communication during roaming.

1 On the iida Home, Settings \rightarrow Wireless & networks

\rightarrow Mobile networks \rightarrow Data roaming.

Tap OK to enable the data roaming.

- · To enable the data roaming, set Area settings to other than Japan in advance.
- If you have not subscribed to IS NET, au.NET charges (525 yen for the used month) and communication charges apply.


Making a Call at Your Travel Destination

Making a Call to Another Country (Including Japan) from Your Travel Destination

You can make a call to Japan or another country from your travel destination.

Example: To call "212-123-XXXX" in the USA from South Korea

- On the iida Home, Phone.
- 2 Enter an international access code, country code, area code and the other party's phone number → Call.



- *1 Long-touch the "0" to enter "+" and the international access code of your travel destination is automatically added when calling.
- *2 If the area code starts with "0", dial it without including the "0" (There are some exceptions such as fixed-line phones in some countries or regions including Italy and Moscow).

• If the person you are dialing is using Global Passport, enter the country code "81" (Japan) regardless of his/her travel destination.

Making a Call within the Same Country While Overseas

You can call to general fixed-line phones or mobile phones with the same method as when calling in Japan.

On the iida Home, Phone.

2 Enter a phone number.

When you use GSM network, enter area code $\mbox{+}$ other party's phone number.

When you use CDMA network, the method for making calls varies depending on where you are calling.

Receiving a Call at Your Travel Destination

You can receive calls with the same method as when receiving calls in Japan.

 If you receive a call while overseas, the call is forwarded from Japan no matter where the call is made from. Call charges to Japan are incurred by the caller and receiving charges by the receiver.

Having Calls Made to Your Travel Destination from Japan

People calling you can use the same method as when calling you from Japan.


Having Calls Made to Your Travel Destination from Countries Other Than Japan

International access code and "81" (Japan) have to be dialed regardless of the travel destination since the call is made through Japan.

Example: To have a call made to your au phone in Japan "090-1234-XXXX" from the USA

Enter an international access code, Japan country

code and phone number of au phone \rightarrow *Call*.



Setting Conditions for Activating the Remote Lock

In the case of loss of your INFOBAR A01, calling the INFOBAR A01 from a specified phone number repeatedly allows you to remotely prevent others from using the INFOBAR A01.

On the iida Home, *Settings* \rightarrow *Location* & *security*

 \rightarrow Lock Setting \rightarrow Remote lock.

Activating the Remote Lock from a specified phone number

Call the INFOBAR A01 from a phone number registered to the valid number list with the set conditions (specified period/number of calls arrived).

- · To activate the Remote lock, notify the caller's phone number.
- The Remote lock cannot be activated when the INFOBAR A01 is turned off or out of service area or *Offline mode* is set. If your INFOBAR A01 is in a location where an adequate signal cannot be received, the Remote lock may not be activated.
- To cancel the Remote lock, call the INFOBAR A01 from a phone number registered to the valid number list with the set conditions (specified period/ number of calls arrived).
- The Remote lock cannot be activated or canceled when your au IC-Card is not inserted or another's au IC-Card is inserted.

Activating the Remote Lock with the Security Lock Service

Even if the Remote lock is not set in advance, the Remote lock can be activated by calling Customer Service Center or completing the application process on au Customer Support from a PC. The Security Lock Service is available free of charge.

 You must fill out an application to use the Security Lock Service (the application can be filled out even after your cell phone is lost).
